

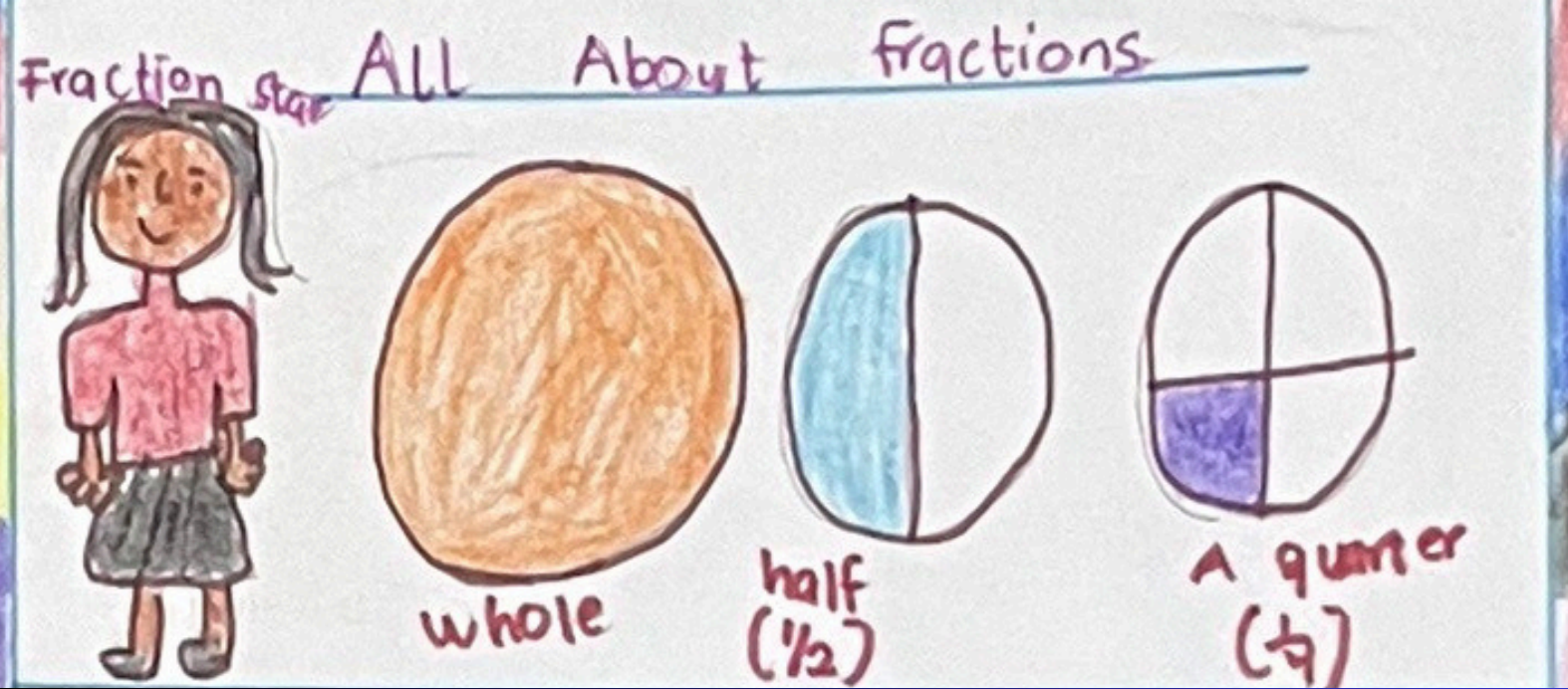


# Year In Review By Class 1 Pupils

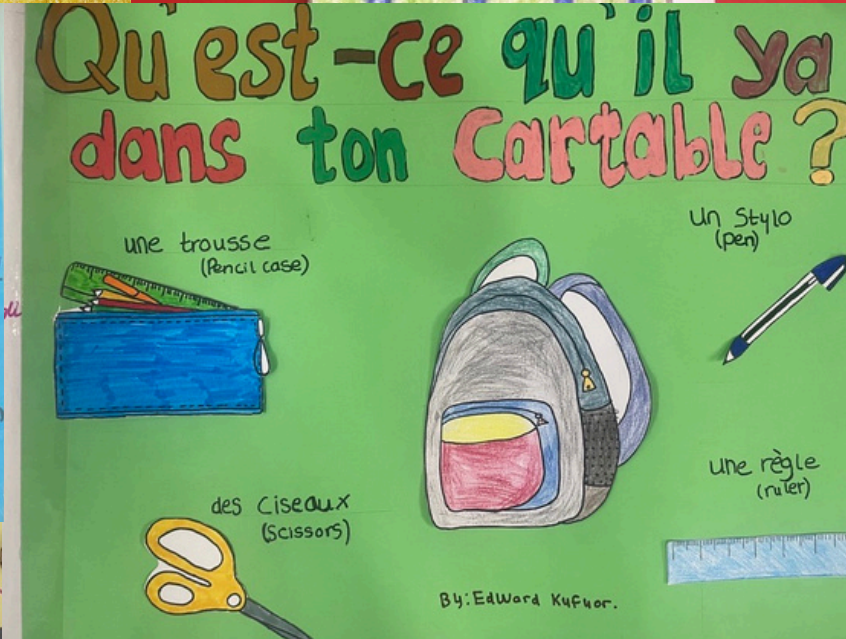
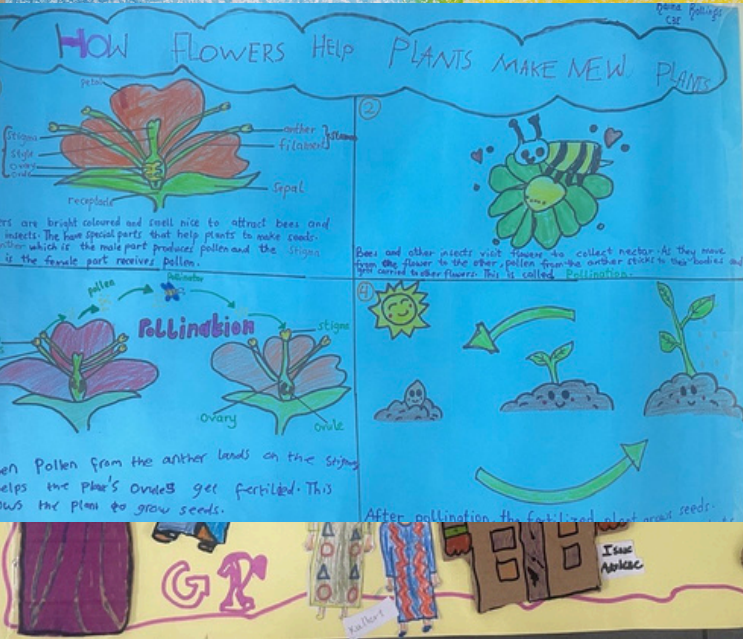


# Year In Review By Class 3 Pupils

We wish them well in their endeavours in Class 4.



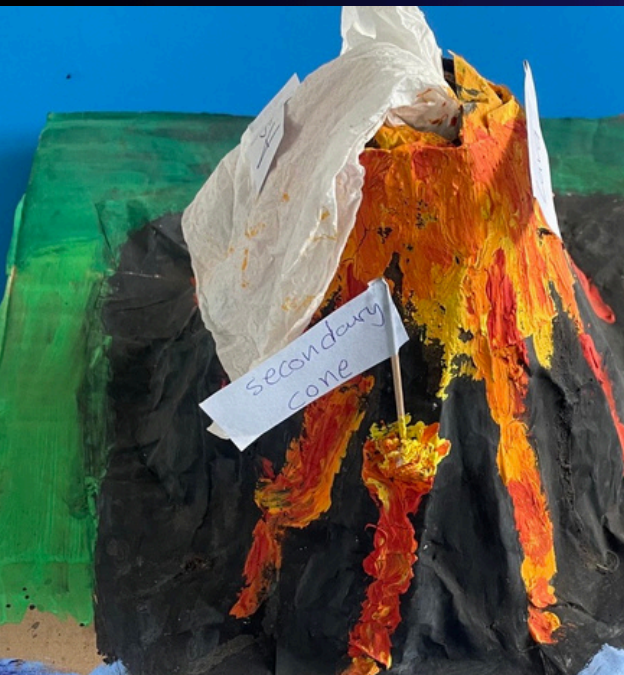

## THE WATER CYCLE

**THE ENDLESS CYCLE**

Water droplets that fall from clouds are called precipitation. Some precipitation is soaked up by the ground and plants. Some drains into rivers, lakes, seas and oceans, where it evaporates and the whole process begins again. This is called the water cycle.

**DIFFERENT STATES**

Water is the only substance to exist naturally as three states of matter. Water is found as a solid when it freezes to form ice. It freezes at 0°C. Above 0°C it melts to form liquid water. When liquid water is heated, it evaporates and turns into a gas called water vapour. Water can evaporate at any temperature above freezing. For example, water in wet washing dries even on a cool day.

**CLIMES FROM**

Evaporates from the surface of rivers, lakes, seas and from the leaves of plants. As water vapour cools, it condenses back to form tiny droplets of water. These form rain clouds. With more moisture, the droplets get bigger and fall to the ground.

## ELECTRICITY

IS electrons on the move!

Electricity can only flow through a complete circuit. It travels from the power source (battery or cell), flowing around the circuit, through the components, then back to the power source. If there is a gap in the circuit, there is a break in the flow of electricity.

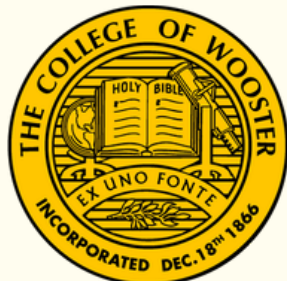

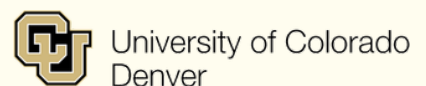
